

The more we escalate the drug war, the more young people and others die.

- October 14, 1982: President Reagan calls for escalation of war on drugs
- Fall, 1984: Drug sentences increase, mandatory sentencing guidelines enacted, Comprehensive Crime Control Act of 1984.
- June 7, 1986: Presidential Directive labels drug trade "a national security concern". Authorizes expanded use of military.
